Modern Slavery and Climate Change: The Commitment of the Cities, held in Vatican City



On July 21st, Mr. Cuauhtémoc Cárdenas Solórzano, Coordinator General of International Affairs, participated in the colloquium entitled “Modern Slavery and Climate Change: The Commitment of the Cities”, held in Vatican City and convened by His Holiness Pope Francis, in representation of the Mexico City Government,

Said colloquium, which was organized by the Pontifical Academy of Sciences and the Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences of the Holy See, brought together more than 70 mayors and local government representatives

from all regions of the world, in order to reflect about the role cities play when facing major social and environmental challenges, globally.

Finally, a hearing presided by Pope Francis took place, during which he highlighted the principles and values of the Encyclical ‘Laudato Si’, which are the basis of the Joint Declaration against Modern Slavery, a cooperation instrument of local governments to promote climate and social action; which was signed by Mr. Cárdenas, on behalf of the Mexico City Government.
