## CDMX and Peru strengthen relations

Under his visit to Lima, the Mayor of Mexico City, Dr. Miguel Ángel Mancera, met with the President of Peru, Ollanta Humala Tasso. In the Cáceres Room of the Government Palace, both shared points of view on topics such as the increase on the minimum wage, mobility, security, health and highways. In addition, they discussed the expansion and deepening of the economic and cultural links between Mexico City and Peru, as well as the mechanisms of cooperation to obtain higher benefits, considering the common elements in the history of both societies.



# Mexico City signs “The Lima Declaration”

**M**exico City and other 20 local governments from seven Latin American countries signed, the past 8th of August, “The Lima Declaration”. This statement acknowledges urban mobility as a fundamental social right for the population.

Subscribed in Lima, Peru, under the First Latin American Cities Leadership on Sustainable Mobility Summit, this Regional Declaration recognizes the need to develop public policies that prioritize the health of the city’s inhabitants. Thus, the commitment aims at fostering the topic of urban sustainable mobility at the core of the climate change global agenda.

During the Summit, the Mayor of Lima, Peru, Susana Villarán, acknowledged the achievements of Mexico City in the field of mobility, that materialized under a Mobility Law. This legislation was made with the inclusion of citizens, political parties, NGO’s and experts.

During this event, the Mayor of Mexico City, Dr. Miguel Ángel Mancera, confirmed the commitment of his administration to duplicate the extension of the Ecobici network, increase the Metrobus routes and substitute 20 thousand obsolete bus units.

### ● CDMX WILL COORDINATE REDCISUR

Mexico City will be in charge of the South American Cities Network (REDCISUR) Coordination. This network includes the cities of Lima, Quito, Buenos Aires, Sucre, Asunción, Santiago, Bogotá, Montevideo, La Paz and Mexico City.

### ● CDMX SEEKS RATIFICATION OF THE SISTER CITY AGREEMENT WITH QUITO

The Mayor of Mexico City, Dr. Miguel Ángel Mancera, and the Mayor of Quito, Mauricio Rodas, subscribed a joint declaration with the intention to ratify the Sister City Agreement between the two cities.

### ● CDMX SIGNS AGREEMENT WITH BOGOTÁ

Mexico City and Bogotá signed an Agreement in which both governments commit to exchange experiences on the topics of transportation, mobility, highways, urban development, environment, health, and international relations.
