

Mayor Mancera names Singapore President Distinguished Guest

On Friday 10 of June, Miguel Ángel Mancera, Mayor of Mexico City, received Mr. Tony Tan, President of the Republic of Singapore, in the City Hall. Mr. Tan was recognized as a Distinguished Guest of Mexico City and was presented the Key to the City.

The ceremony was attended by Mrs. Mary Tan, the President's wife; Dr. Edgar Elías Azar, President of the High Court of Justice; Mr. Cuauhtémoc Cárdenas Solórzano, General Coordinator of International Affairs; and Mr. Salomón Chertorivski Woldenberg,

During the meeting, the need for a closer economic, educational, technological and cultural cooperation was highlighted. Dr. Mancera acknowledged Singapore as an example to follow, for its success in economy, sustainable urban development, security, and for its anticorruption efforts. They also reaffirmed their commitment for welfare and social equity, through public

policies focused on people and their main needs.
