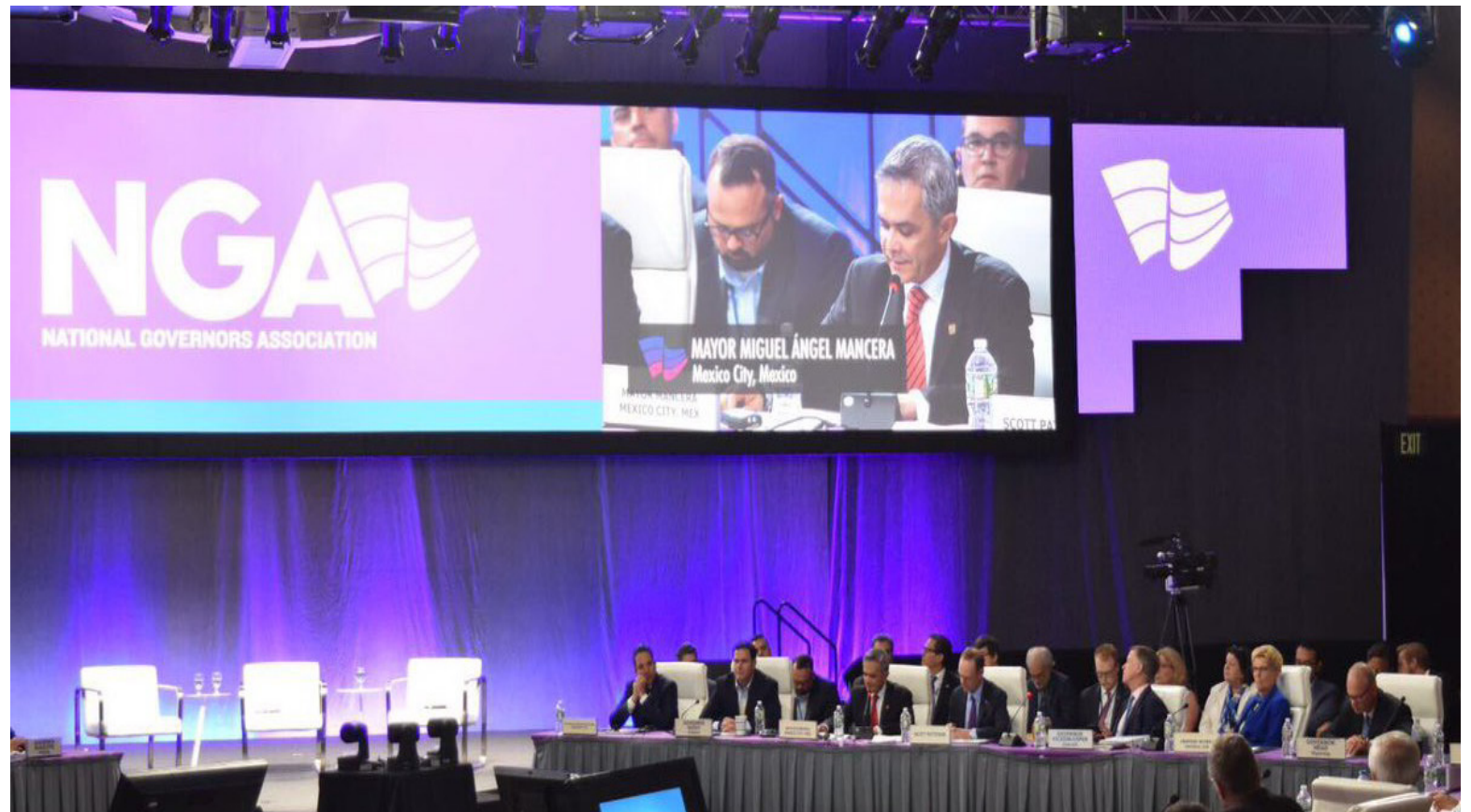


Mayor of Mexico City participates in meeting of the US National Governors Association

Miguel Angel Mancera, Mayor of Mexico City and President of the National Conference of Governors (CONAGO), participated in the meeting of the US National Governors Association, held on July 14, 2017 in Rhode Island, to which the Vice President of the United States, Mike Pence; the Prime Minister of Canada, Justin Trudeau; as well as local leaders from North America attended.

In this context, he called on the governors of the United States and Canada to promote economic integration in the region and cooperation from the local level towards the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) renegotiation, in favor of all sectors and citizens.

Mayor Mancera also signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Governor of Virginia, Terry McAuliffe, with the aim of promoting investment, trade and tourism.
