

Mexico City and Madrid sign Memorandum of Understanding



On November 22, 2017, the Mayor Miguel Angel Mancera Espinosa appointed Distinguished Guest of Mexico City to the Mayor of Madrid, Spain, Manuela Carmena Castrillo, in a ceremony held in the Old City Hall. In this context, Mayor Mancera expressed his gratitude for the solidarity and help from the Spain and Madrid governments after the earthquake that occurred in Mexico City last September, noting that this is proof of the close relationship between our countries and capitals.

He highlighted the collaboration between both capitals on issues of common interest and within the framework of international city networks such as C40 and the Union of Iberoamerican Capital Cities (UCCI) to promote joint development, mainly

in sustainable and social matters. He also underlined the active participation of Mexico City and Madrid in important international forums for local governments, such as Habitat III in Quito, Ecuador in 2016, dedicated to promote the role of cities in the implementation of the Sustainable Development Agenda and the New Urban Agenda globally.

As part of the objectives of this meeting, both leaders signed a Memorandum of Understanding, in which they expressed the willingness to strengthen the ties of friendship and cooperation on the following topics: cultural development; technological innovation; local economic development; social development and the new human rights agenda; political dialogue and global strategy.

On that occasion, the Slovakian President and the Mayor shared experiences related to the Political Constitution of Mexico City and the creation of coalition governments in the European country. In the same way, they expressed the will of both governments to strengthen ties of friendship and cooperation, mainly in terms of economic development, technological innovation, culture and tourism.
