

Mayor of Mexico City meets with the Commissioner of Mobility and Transport of the European Commission

On Thursday, January 11, at the Old City Hall, the Mayor of Mexico City, Miguel Ángel Mancera, accompanied by the Coordinator General of International Affairs, Cuauhtémoc Cárdenas Solórzano and the Minister of Mobility, Carlos Augusto Meneses; received a delegation headed by the Commissioner of Mobility and Transport of the European Commission, Violeta Bulc.

The objectives of this meeting were to exchange experiences and good practices in the field of transport and mobility, as well as to reinforce the cooperation ties between the European Union and Mexico City. Within this framework, Commissioner Bulc acknowledged the policies and programs in this area that have recently been carried out in our capital, such as the New Model of Mobility, the Comprehensive Road Safety Program, Vision Zero, the CDMX Street System and Sustainable Urban Mobility, among others.



CDMX joins the first meeting of U20, in Paris, France



Representatives from more than 20 cities, including Mexico City, New York, Chicago, Montreal and Tokyo, met on January 29 and 30 in Paris, France, on the occasion of the first meeting of U20, a C40 initiative dedicated to raise the profile of urban issues and enhance the role of cities in the G20 agenda.

In several discussions –and with the presence of the Mayor of Paris, Anne Hidalgo, and Mayor of Buenos Aires, Horacio Rodríguez Larreta–, joint messages and inclusive solutions for global issues such as climate action, the future of work and social integration were also developed.

In this way, the meeting served as a starting point for the work to be carried out towards the Inaugural U20 Mayors Summit, an event that will take place in Buenos Aires, in October 2018, prior to the G20 Heads of State Summit hosted by Argentina.
